Dear Journal,

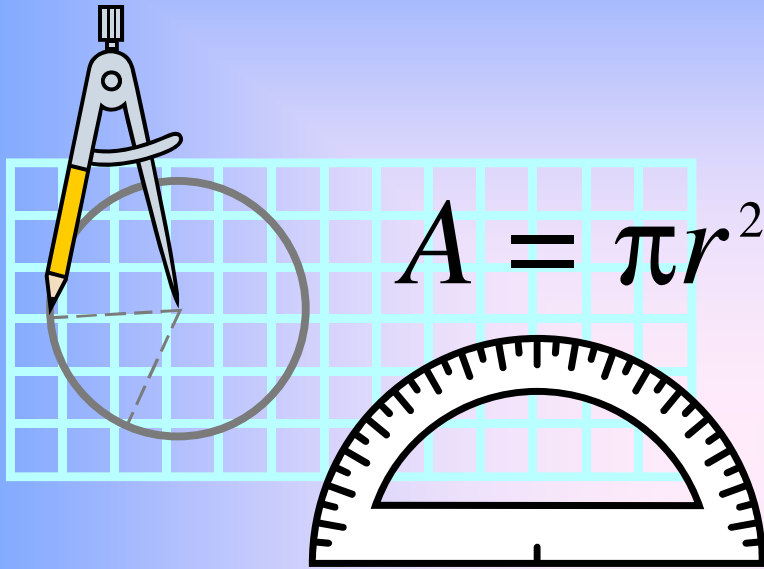

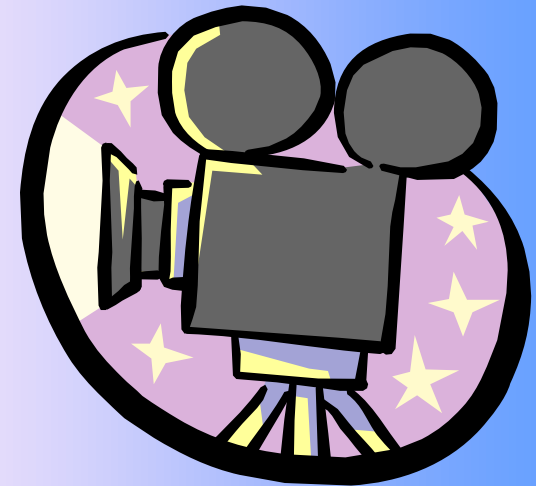
